

What did you personally get out of this training?

Repetition of the fundamentals. I have had extensive active shooter/tactical entry type training as an LEO and as a LEO firearms instructor and I believe the best training includes repetition of the fundamentals. In addition to the repetition of the fundamentals, I was able to view the techniques from a new perspective due to the instructors' experiences and teaching techniques.

Do you feel that the training is beneficial to law enforcement?

The training allows law enforcement officers the ability to know what to do in a critical situation and be able to do it without hesitation.

In what way?

In a high stress situation, it is critical for the law enforcement officer to at least visualize what it would do in a situation and better yet, practice what to do. Without this, the law enforcement officer puts themselves in greater danger, they hesitate and are less effective in stopping the threat. It is the same as an Olympic down hill skier, if you watch them before a run, you can see them moving their body side to side as they are visualizing going down the hill in their mind. Same thing, the more our mind has been exposed to different situations, the more it will be prepared if a similar situation arises.

Would you recommend this class to other law enforcement agencies?

Absolutely. The trainers brought an extensive knowledge and personal experience to the training, plus open minded to other experiences. I picked up a lot of details from the instructors I had not picked up in any other similar trainings.
